### **Overview of Department**

Plan International UK is an independent development and humanitarian charity that advances children's rights and equality for girls. We believe in the power and potential of every child. But this is often suppressed by poverty, violence, exclusion and discrimination. And it's girls who are most affected. Working together with children, young people, our supporters and partners, we strive for a just world, tackling the root causes of the challenges facing girls and all vulnerable children. We support children's rights from birth until they reach adulthood. And we enable children to prepare for – and respond to – crises and adversity. We drive changes in practice and policy at local, national and global levels using our reach, experience and knowledge. We have been building powerful partnerships for children for 80 years, and are now active in more than 70 countries. By 2022 we want to help 100 million girls learn, lead, decide and thrive.

The 65-person Policy and Programmes Directorate supports these aims by ensuring that Plan International UK delivers the highest quality policy and programmes. This is an exciting time to join as we implement a range of ambitious plans designed to make us 'the' best among our peers. We want to be known for our expertise in girl's rights and youth, highly-competitive in Education, Economic Security, Child Protection, Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) and Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH), and be seen as an ambitious, quickly expanding player in the humanitarian space. We constantly enhance programme quality and effectiveness, raise income from institutional donors (like the British Government), and drive change through setting and influencing policy agendas.

Plan International UK is committed to strongly developing its disasters work and in time aspires to becoming a centre of excellence in Child Protection, Education and Disaster Risk Management. The Disaster Risk Management Unit (DRMU) works across the whole spectrum of disaster work from risk reduction through to recovery, working in collaboration with many of the major NGOs in consortia and as a DEC and START Network member, dealing with rapid response, disaster risk reduction, and conflict sensitivity. DRMU Programme Specialists support our country offices in quality programme development and delivery, assisting with the development of strong donor relationships, and providing technical support for humanitarian work. In addition to their geographic focus each Programme Specialist is expected to be the team's technical lead and reference point of one of the Unit's priority areas. Currently these are Gender, Child Protection in Emergencies, Accountability and Education in Emergencies (EiE).

## Job Purpose

 Support the development of Plan International UK's disasters and emergencies portfolio as part of the Disaster Risk Management Unit, with particular responsibility for ensuring the promotion and integration of EiE across the DRMU programme portfolio, including programming that addresses disaster risk, and strengthening community resilience.

- Develop and manage a significant part of Plan International UK's disasters grants portfolio, and raise the profile of the organisation as a humanitarian actor.
- Work across various areas, including grant management, programme development, and relationship building both internally and externally to Plan International UK.
- Act as a resource for the international organisation, providing support to disaster response on a deployment basis if required.
- Ensure a good flow of information to other departments within Plan International UK, particularly related to aspects of programme leaning, quality and policy related to Education in Emergencies, and as the EiE focal point for the DRMU.

The job is based in London, but will require travel to Country Offices for approximately 30% of the time.
